We hope you are happy with your choice of e-book(s), but if you are not completely satisfied (for any reason!) **within the first 7 days after the purchase**, you may request a full refund. Note: Since the item in question is digital in nature – it is essentially not ‘returnable.’ Having said this, you have two choices: simply delete the item(s) you purchased or keep them.
